When scholars leave Monroe Demonstration Academy after 8th grade, they will be better equipped for high school course options, scholarship opportunities, and extracurricular activities that are aligned with their interests and academic/career goals and be making tangible progress towards college and career readiness.

# INQUIRY/ PROJECT-BASED LEARNING

We offer a class period dedicated to practical application called inquiry/project-based learning (iPBL). During this time, scholars apply skills from their academy courses to address a problem and find a solution by starting a program within our school and community.

As our scholars progress, the iPBL time becomes more student directed:

**-6th grade** focuses on addressing an issue within their grade level. The problem is defined for scholars and they are tasked with finding potential solutions.

**-7th grade** focuses on addressing an issue within our school. Students will discover a problem themselves using root cause analysis and will work to find potential solutions. 7th grade scholars also help to lead 6th graders with their project.

**-8th grade** focuses on addressing an issue outside of our school walls and coming up with an idea that will benefit our community. Students will identify the problem and solution on their own and request assistance from their instructor as needed.
